**WEBUILD FOR THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE ‘CUORE’ HEART CENTRE
OF THE GEMELLI POLYCLINIC IN ROME**

- *Webuild to build the new “CUORE” Heart Centre together with its subsidiary NBI*
- *New sustainable facility integrated into Gemelli Polyclinic campus, covering 27,000 square metres, with 100 beds and 9 operating rooms*

MILAN, September 29, 2025 – A project of excellence in patient care comes to life: Webuild and the Fondazione Policlinico Gemelli have signed a contract for the construction of the ‘CUORE’ Heart Centre at the Policlinico Universitario Agostino Gemelli IRRCS (Gemelli University Polyclinic) in Rome, Italy. The project, announced on World Heart Day, will be carried out by Webuild, through its subsidiary NBI.

“With the construction of the new CUORE Heart Centre, Webuild brings a deep expertise acquired after years of experience in the hospital sector,” said Pietro Salini, Chief Executive of Webuild. “Investing in healthcare infrastructure today means investing in the future. It means investing in the resilience of healthcare and in the quality of life of a country’s people. It shows how bringing engineering and technology together can create value for communities. CUORE is a project that brings together healthcare, research and sustainability, embodying our vision of infrastructure capable of establishing a foundation for future generations.”

The new centre — to be located on the university campus — will create an iconic architectural footprint and become a clinical and scientific hub for the prevention, diagnosis, and treatment of cardiovascular disease. The project was commissioned by Fondazione Policlinico Gemelli in collaboration with the Università Cattolica del Sacro Cuore, the Istituto G. Toniolo di Studi Superiori, and the support of Fondazione Roma. The name of the project, 'CUORE' (Cardiovascular Unique Offer ReEngineered), reflects the mission of proximity, care, and innovation that the Gemelli Polyclinic has embodied since its foundation.

With a total floor area of 27,000 m², the 'CUORE' Heart Centre will have 100 beds for ordinary hospitalisation, 28 beds for intensive care, 16 day hospital beds, and nine operating rooms. It will have advanced technology for cardiovascular imaging and telehealth. It will be built by Webuild, guaranteeing architectural and functional continuity with the existing hospital via two connections. Binini Partners will act as the designer.

Following tradition but also looking towards the future, the 'CUORE' Heart Centre will serve as an example of environmental sustainability. The centre will be equipped with a 180-kW photovoltaic system, air conditioning with a low environmental impact, and large windows to maximise natural light and improve comfort in treatment areas.

The Gemelli is also an academic and research centre connected to the Università Cattolica del Sacro Cuore, the largest Catholic university in Europe. Established in 1964, the Polyclinic is one of the main Scientific Institutes for Research, Hospitalisation, and Healthcare ("IRCCS") in Italy, with more than 1,500 beds and over 5,000 employees.

The construction of the 'CUORE' Heart Centre reinforces Webuild Group's strong international presence in the hospital sector. The project adds to the more than 200 healthcare structures built by the Group around the world, including the Ospedale dell'Angelo in Venice-Mestre, the Four Hospitals in Tuscany and the South-East Bari Hospital in Monopoli-Fasano, in Italy. In Australia, the Group was recently awarded the contract for the construction of the Women and Babies Hospital in Perth.

The Group is also present in the sector through its subsidiary NBI, which focuses on projects such as Block F of the Careggi University Hospital in Florence — with a floor area of nearly 10,000 m² and more than 150 beds — and the DEAS Pavilion 12 at the same hospital, dedicated to clinical and surgical emergencies in the Trauma Centre.

Webuild is a global leader in the construction of large, complex infrastructure projects, with a focus on sustainable mobility, hydropower, water treatment, and green buildings. A recognized leader in the water sector and active in about 50 countries, the Group employs approximately 95,000 people of over 125 nationalities. It boasts nearly 120 years of experience with over 3,700 completed projects. Its track record includes 13,648 kilometres of railways, 891 kilometres of metro lines, 82,577 kilometres of roads and highways, 1,022 kilometres of bridges and viaducts, 3,462 kilometres of tunnels, and 318 dams and hydropower plants. Among its most iconic projects are the expansion of the Panama Canal, the Long Beach International Gateway bridge in California (USA), the Second Bosphorus Bridge (Turkey), the Sydney Metro Northwest skytrain viaduct and bridge (Australia), the Kingdom Centre skyscraper in Riyadh (Saudi Arabia), and metro lines in cities such as Copenhagen, Paris, Rome, Milan, Naples, Doha, Thessaloniki, and Riyadh. Ongoing projects include the New Genoa Breakwater, the Brenner Base Tunnel, the Pedemontana Lombarda Highway, Metro di Roma's Line C, the Genoa-Milan and Naples-Bari high-speed/high-capacity railways, the Palermo-Catania-Messina high-capacity railway, the Snowy 2.0 hydropower scheme in Australian and the Trojena dams in Saudi Arabia. As of December 31, 2024, the Group registered total revenues for €12 billion. As of June 30, 2025, its total order backlog stands at approximately €59 billion, with over 90% of its construction backlog related to projects linked to the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs). Listed on the Borsa Italiana stock exchange in Milan (WBD; WBD.MI; WBD:IM), it is member of the MIB ESG index of Italian companies with best ESG practices. Headquartered in Italy, it is subject to the management and coordination of Salini Costruttori S.p.A.
